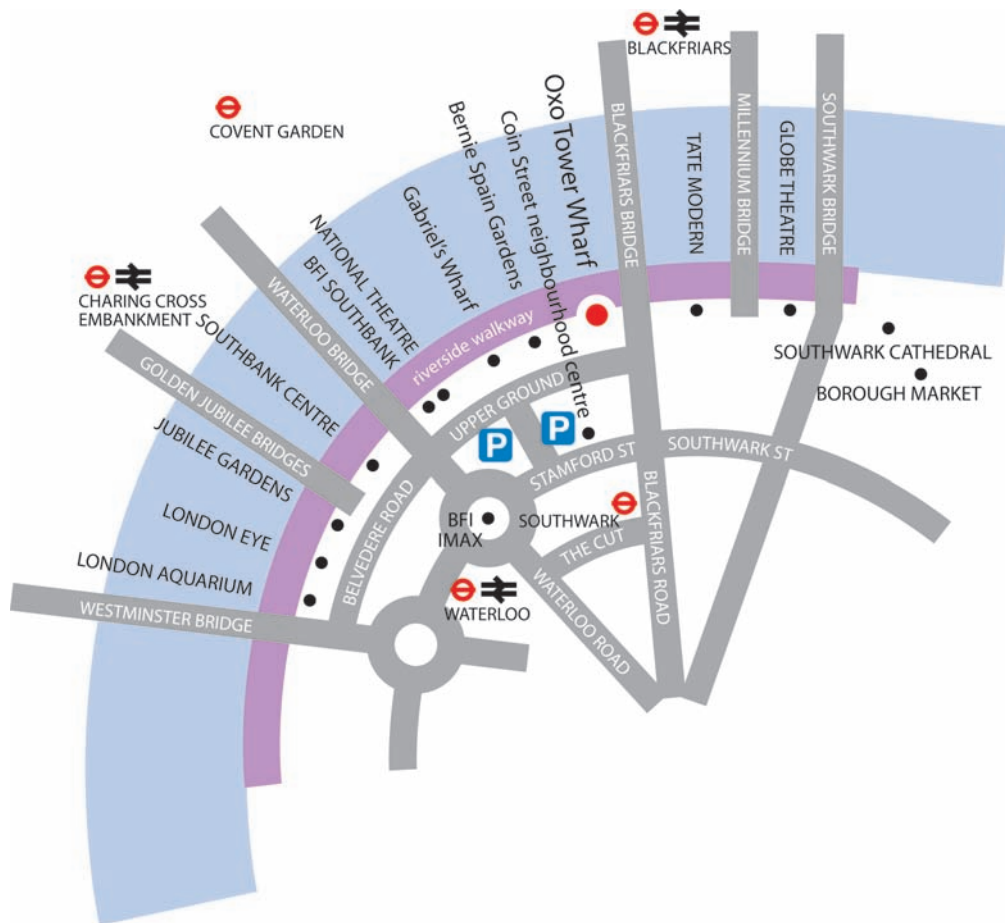

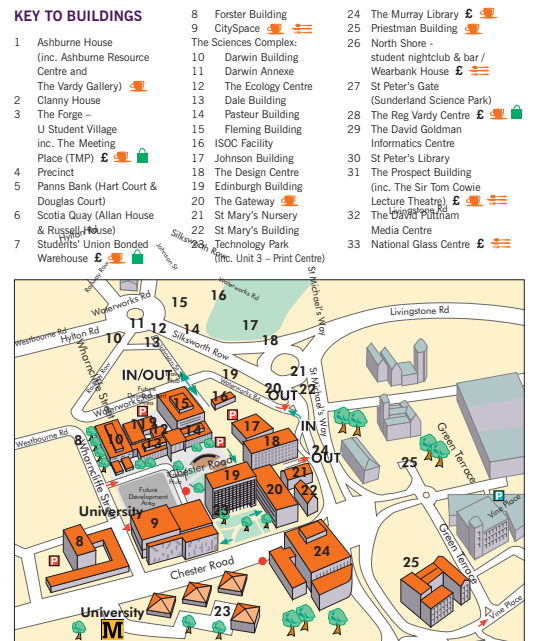

Travel to Bath by Train

Bath Spa train station is located in the centre of Bath. It is a short walk from the city's shops and attractions. There are regular train services direct from London Paddington and London Waterloo to Bath Spa, with an average journey time of around 90 minutes from Paddington and 120 minutes from Waterloo. Bristol Temple Meads is just 15 minutes away by train. It is a major hub for travel to all other parts of the country. A number of services to Bath Spa will change at Bristol Temple Meads including services from northern England, Scotland, Devon and Cornwall. You can get direct trains to Bath Spa from a number of destinations in the UK including Cardiff. Regular train services run from Cardiff Central train station to Bath Spa, with an average journey time of around 65 minutes.

Travel to Bath by Coach

National Express coaches www.nationalexpress.com offer good value travel, linking all major towns and cities in Europe. Services to Bath bus station run from many of the country's major destinations, with frequent direct services from London and its major airports arriving in the city via the convenient M4 motorway link.

Travel to Bath by Car

Bath is 10 miles from junction 18 of the M4 motorway which runs direct from London and Heathrow Airport. There are excellent motorway links from the North, Devon and Cornwall via the M5 motorway. Wales is a short drive west on the M4 motorway.

Parking in Bath

Bath is well served by four Park & Ride services and thirteen car parks as well as additional on street parking.

Park and Ride (recommended)

For a stress free visit to Bath use one of the four Park & Ride services. There are services from three sites Monday to Friday and four sites on Saturdays with regular bus services into the city running at least every 15 minutes. All buses are wheelchair and pushchair friendly.

Lansdown (North of Bath) BA1 9BJ - Monday to Saturday 06.15 to 20.30 (except public holidays)

Newbridge (West of Bath) BA1 3NB - Monday to Saturday 06.15 to 20.30 (except public holidays)

Odd Down (South of Bath) BA2 8PA - Monday to Saturday 06.15 to 20.30 (except public holidays)

University of Bath (East of Bath) BA2 7AY (Saturdays only 08.30 to 18.30)

Bath is a World Heritage Site so please take care when you are driving around the city. There are a number of one way streets and bus gates in operation.

There is a limited amount of on-street parking in Bath. Charges apply from 08.00 to 19.00, Monday to Saturday and clearly marked signposts indicate maximum stay. Pay and display machines are in operation on the roadside and prices start from £1.20-£1.40 for 30 minutes and then 50p per 15 minutes thereafter. Charges do not apply on Sundays and Bank Holidays.

Disabled Parking in Bath

Bath and North East Somerset Council operate a Blue Badge scheme for disabled car users. Designated easy access parking bays are available in most city centre car parks. Charges apply in all Bath and North East Somerset Council car parks for Blue Badge holders with the exception of the sports centre car park. There are designated on-street disabled parking bays in the city centre which are marked with a white bay and the words Disabled. You can also park in permit and pay and display on-street parking spaces without limit. When parking on-street you need to display your Blue Badge at all times.

Parking on yellow lines is permitted for a maximum of 3 hours except where there is a ban on loading and unloading. Both the badge and time clock must be clearly and correctly displayed. Please note Blue Badge holders are not exempt from the tow away scheme should the parked vehicle create a hazard.
