


FESTIVAL OF CALLIGRAPHY

15 – 21 AUGUST
2021

This is our 27th Festival of Calligraphy and our first at Warwick University, based in the heart of the UK and easily accessible from across the UK, and the world. We are thrilled to have internationally renowned and exciting tutors coming from Argentina, Europe and the UK. The Arden Conference Centre is located at the University of Warwick which lies on the outskirts of Coventry, 3 miles from the city centre. Easily accessible from many major routes: M1, M6, M5, M42, A5 and A14. Coventry is on the West Coast Mainline, serviced by regular trains, 7 days a week. Birmingham International Airport is approximately 20 minutes away.

Registration will be on Sunday afternoon. Session 1 workshops are from Monday morning until Wednesday lunchtime and session 2 runs from Wednesday lunchtime until Friday afternoon. There will be a gala dinner on Friday night and delegates leave on Saturday morning after breakfast.

SESSION 1 The Act of Writing with Pointed Instruments

This course explores handwriting as a form of expression that can be independent from the rules of legibility and deeply connected with the wholeness of body and mind. After a basic study of the rules that make writing by hand a shared language, we will start with a series of exercises to rethink the act of writing and explore its potential in terms of experience and expression. You will use all kinds of pointed instruments and will complete a book as visual record of the workshop experience.

SESSION 1 Paper Cut-Lettering and Embossing

With its renewed popularity, this workshop explores three related aspects of cut-lettering, that includes embossing and stencilling techniques. All three methods can be used as complementary elements to your calligraphic creations, or as inventive stand-alone pieces.

Beginning with the basics of cut-lettering you will experiment with adding simple complementary decorative and illustrative elements (with templates to get you started) and learn how to utilise the usually discarded cut-out pieces, (so that the cut pieces are used too). Then moving on to embossing and de-bossing techniques; and lastly incorporating stencilling ideas and techniques into your repertoire.

SESSION 1 Calligraphy in Blossom

Rachel Yallop is a British calligrapher and lettering designer. Her love of letters stems from a lifelong passion for drawing with her original calligraphic works exploring form, space, tension and freedom of line. Rachel studied at Ravensbourne and then the Central School of Art & Design in London, gaining an MA in 1985.

SESSION 1 Abstract Designs and Large Letters Using a Flat Brush

I love the incomparable contrast of black and white and particularly the drama of white letters on a black background. Add to this an accent or two of striking red and the design will come alive. This class will concentrate on this limited but highly effective colour palette using flat brush, gouache, compressed charcoal, pastel and eraser to create a series of stunning pieces for the wall.

You will master techniques to create sweeping lines and expressive letters; explore texture, line, form and overlapping strokes; learn how to crop 'titles' from larger designs, work them further and assemble finished designs in a variety of formats.

(beginners, intermediate, advanced)

SESSION 2 Empty Space, Womb of Shape

For Eastern art the empty space is the fourth of the principles of the Taoist Rules for Beauty. The Taoist painters treat empty space as a positive matter, as the origin of form. Then we will work through a basic technique, learning how to devise a 'family' of letters that work together as a unified group, by experimenting with either your writing or drawing skills, (or both) to come up with some inventive letters to use in your work.

(beginners, intermediate, advanced)

SESSION 2 Inventive Letters

We have all probably been in a situation where we have our words, but just don't know which script to use... So, this fun workshop, for all levels, gives you the opportunity to experiment, and create your own script(s).

First, we will begin by looking at ideas and ways that we can modify, decorate or adapt formal scripts. Then we will work through a basic technique, learning how to devise a 'family' of letters that work together as a unified group, by experimenting with either your writing or drawing skills, (or both) to come up with some inventive letters to use in your work.

SESSION 2 The Act of Writing with Broad Edge Pens

This course explores the possibilities of calligraphy as a form of honest expression. You will only work with non-retouched, non-corrected lines, repeating gestures as you would if you were learning to dance. This is not a course about beautiful writing, I should not therefore use the word calligraphy, it is a course about writing by hand. We will search for lines and forms that are expressions of our own energy and become aware of their communicative potential.

(beginners, intermediate, advanced)

SESSION 2 Ruling Pen Techniques: Cola, Folded and Pointed Ruling Pens

The ruling pen is a very versatile tool, coming in more than one form: the folded, the pointed, and the Cola pen. Different shapes within these groups affect the marks made. We will look at the various tools and make a Cola pen. The ruling pen, of whichever sort, makes a unique line. You will learn how to hold and manipulate the pen, how to achieve the spatter effect, to look at the marks made and how to enhance lines through touch-up. Practicing formal and informal letter shapes for ultimate contrast, you will work on finished pieces; large multi-lined, textured letters; built-up capitals; word design or a combination of all.

(beginners, intermediate, advanced)

SESSION 2 Marina Sorria

Based in Argentina, Marina works as an experimental calligrapher, book artist and artist, teaching at home and abroad. Her main interest is the experimental aspect of calligraphy. Her goal is to mingle and blend art, textile art, graphic design, sumi-e and calligraphy to challenge the limits of conceptual art and technique.

SESSION 2 Modern Copperplate

The beautiful, graceful style of lettering that we commonly refer to as Copperplate is actually a style called English Roundhand. Slightly different shaped script referred to as 'Copperplate' since many of these styles were popular when printed from engraved copperplates from mid 1500s to mid 1800s. The Universal Penman, published by George Bickham in 1740, presented Copperplate writing to the wider public and is still widely used by many calligraphers. This workshop will cover brief script analysis, exploration of different inks, pens and papers. SESSION 2 Pointed Pen Flourished Decorations

The art of flourishing has been around for as long as humans have been writing. A great treat is that, rather than learning an entirely new handwriting system, will flourishes can instead be incorporated into your current writing practice. We will take a sweeping look at the history of flourishes, examine how to break down their construction and discuss what appeals to modern eyes. Entry and exit strokes, stand-alone decorative elements, the principles of correct shape, size and fundamentals of line are part of the addictive world of flourished decorations. Learn what makes a stroke beautiful and how to use repeating designs. Have fun discovering all the ways to make even simple flourishes really sing!

(beginners, intermediate, advanced)

SESSION 2 Weiiko Kespersaks

Weiiko Kespersaks is a fellow of CLAS and runs a successful Calligraphy Studio in London. He was Programme Leader for the Calligraphy Degree course at Satakunta University of Applied Sciences, Finland. His qualifications include BA First Class in Calligraphy Art History, and Master of Research with Distinction from Roehampton University.
