The bottom margin could be more generous, equal to or slightly more than the top margin, however, overall, this is an interesting concept.

Judges' Comments: I like the texture created here and the division of the bigger square into 9 smaller ones using gold which is always such a good foil to blacks and greys. The freely written, almost handwriting, rather than a formal script, is a good choice for this purpose, but perhaps a little marred by some errors and uncomfortable ascender/descender clashes. Free writing can benefit from control and accuracy for best effect, and this will come over time. However, it is a competent and brave approach to a painful subject representing dementia.

A few letters look a little heavier than others, but otherwise the writing has rhythm and spacing is balanced. Good choice of a ranged-left arrangement, well executed.

#### Ref: 28 - SUNITA AUGER

Tools and Materials: Wood Block Covered in Hand Made Papers

**Judges' Comments:** Good use of materials, the manipulation and see-through of the large letters work well with the hand-made paper. Good use of a contrasting colour (blue) for the 'odd one out'. There may have been other options for the placement of the small writing? Overall, a good, sympathetic representation and design.

Judges' Comments: Sensitively chosen colour matching of ink and mount. Given the space restriction the writing size could have been much smaller to allow for more white space to highlight the poem and even out the balance between lettering and design element. A very delicate piece overall, well done!

Given the lush ultramarine of the mount and the lettering it would be interesting to see the waves in tones of ultramarine rather than cerulean blue. Good work!

Love the golden dot highlight, the tone on tone choices - simply fabulous!
