

COLOUR & TEXTURE, CLAS Specialist Skills Award

OUTLINE:

Explore colour for calligraphy in many varied forms to expand your repertoire; in the pen, on backgrounds, trying out materials & techniques and learning colour mixing for the best outcomes.

TEACHING DELIVERY

All tuition is online, via 8 Zoom sessions and to keep up the momentum, homework is sent in before the next module. You will have 3 or 4 weeks in which to complete and submit your assignment for each module. (See Course Calendar below).

The first online class takes place on the 26th March, this will be a slightly extended session to allow for introductions and Zoom and Padlet instructions. For the remaining classes the teaching is delivered in 1½ hour Zoom sessions; this allows time for questions. That is 12 hours of teaching in total. It is hoped that students can attend in real time, but in any case, the sessions will be recorded and available for the duration of the course.

Students will have access to an online noticeboard (Padlet) where they will be able to post work for real-time feedback i.e. before they submit the module assignment. These posts will be visible to other students, as well as the tutors, and provide useful feedback for the entire group.

If you intend to submit for the Specialist Skills Award, posting your work on Padlet does **not** preclude the need to send your assignments by post to the tutors for assessment.

COURSE FORMAT

Module A: Colourful Penwork – CMYK colour theory, mixing gouache, lightfastness, pen technique, greys.

Module B: So Much to Choose – colour theory with watercolours, pigments and their properties, paper quality, brushes & washes.

Module C: Colour on Colour – paste papers, collage, coloured papers, writing on colour.

Module D: Colour & Texture – washes, textures and lots of experimenting.

(Module E), the Final Assignment, draws on techniques covered in the course and comprises 2 projects, a book and a calligraphic broadsheet, using the previous learning. There will be 6 weeks to complete and submit this assignment for assessment; this is the final submission.

There are 5 Assignments in total -

Assignments for Modules A, B, C, D and E. Each assignment carries 20% of the overall mark.

Submission of work for Award assessment is optional. If a candidate is successful in attaining the Award, a certificate will be presented at the following AGM.
